Core Surgical Topics

Template

Create your presentation using the following template for consistency:

1. Start with before and after photos.
2. Provide any special pre-op instructions.
3. Mark the patient.
4. Show your steps in surgery.
5. Explain post-op care.
6. Discuss final results and aftercare.
7. End with pearls, reminders and bullet points.

Steps to Record Your Talk:

1. Prepare your PPT using this template for the opening slides:
https://www.cosmeticsurgery.org/resource/resmgr/digital_library/aacs-video-intro-slides.pptx . (A dialogue box will open, directing you to save the file to your computer.)
2. Record your lecture. It is best if you can record the lecture in a format that combines your presentation slides/videos and a recording of you presenting them.
 - a. You can record your video right in PowerPoint, using your microphone and webcam. Click here for instructions: <https://support.microsoft.com/en-us/office/record-a-slide-show-with-narration-and-slide-timings-0b9502c6-5f6c-40ae-b1e7-e47d8741161c>. Once you are done recording, export the video to MP4 format.
 - b. Loom also provides presentation-recording technology in a nicely formatted way and is free to use. To start, navigate to <https://www.loom.com> and click on "Get Loom for free." Follow the instructions to sign up, verify your e-mail and download the Desktop App.
3. Video your surgery, in landscape orientation. You are responsible for HIPPA compliance and obtaining any necessary permissions from your patient.
4. Edit your video. There are several free video editing tools available, such as the ones on these lists:

5. Submit your video to Rita Kaufman, AACS Project Manager, rkaufman@cosmeticsurgery.org using WeTransfer, Dropbox, Google Drive or another app for large file transfers.
6. Include with your video submission:
 - a. A one- or two-sentence description.
 - b. Three learning objectives.
