KEYNOTE SPEAKER

PIERRE FOURNIER, MD A Cosmetic Surgeon Looks at Beauty

FRANCE

Cosmetic surgeons are excellent technicians, but many of them are not aware of what is "beauty." There are many definitions of beauty: it is a combination of qualities such as form and proportion in a human face (or other object) which delight the sight; it is a balance between shape and volume; it is an ensemble of shapes and proportions which bring us pleasure and which we admire, but the

concept varies according to different cultures. The best explanation is the one given by Konrad Lorenz, Nobel Prize of Medicine and Physiology winner in 1973. His theory, very different of the previous ones, is explained. The different elements of the male and female human face will be examined. The goal is better understand the facial language, the physiology and the facial artistic anatomy. The conclusion is that the "cult of beauty" is in fact a culture.

Considered by many to be the founding father of liposuction, AACS is honored to welcome Dr. Pierre F. Fournier as our keynote speaker and distinguished guest. After completing his studies at the University of Paris, Dr. Fournier completed training and residencies in both Paris and Great Britain. With numerous books and articles to his credit, Dr. Fournier pioneered the use of liposculpture. Dr. Fournier is co-founder and Secretary General of the International Society of Lipolysis and Body Sculpturing, and in 1988, was elected Lifetime Honorary President of the French National Society of Aesthetic Surgery. He teaches at the Center for Teaching and Research in Aesthetic Surgery in Paris, and is visiting professor at the Medical School of Buenos Aires, Argentina. Dr. Fournier continues to practice aesthetic plastic surgery in private practice in Paris.



EWALDO BOLIVAR DE SOUZA PINTO, MD Skin Retraction After Liposuction BRAZIL

Considered in the world of cosmetic surgery to be a leading authority on rhinoplasty, the American Academy of Cosmetic Surgery welcomes Dr. Ewaldo Bolivar de Souza Pinto to this year's Scientific Meeting. Dr. Pinto is a graduate of Universidade Federal Fluminense in Brazil and completed his residency in plastic surgery with Dr. Ivo Pitanguy at PUC in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Today, Dr. Pinto serves as Head Doctor of the Plastic Surgery Service for the University of Santa Cecilia dos Bandeirantes. In addition to his surgical and educational commitments, Dr. Pinto has authored numerous papers on the subject of rhinoplasty surgery. Furthermore, he acts as Director of the

Postgraduate Studies in Plastic Surgery at UNISANTA, a Board of Director member for the Brazilian Society of Plastic Surgery and was the Founder, and continues to retain membership, of the Lipoplasty University. Dr. Pinto resides in Santos, Brazil.



Marco Gasparotti, MD *Tridimensional Body Reshaping*

ITALY

After receiving his medical degree at the University of Rome, Dr. Marco Gasparotti specialized in Plastic Surgery at the University of Parma. In 1982, he created a new technique called "superficial liposcultpure," which has revolutionized the lipoaspiration procedure. Since 1991, he has been invited to teach his technique by the University of California San Diego, as well as numerous other prestigious schools all over the world. He is also a presenter and guest speaker for courses sponsored by the International Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ISAPS) and the American Society of Plastic Surgery (ASPS). In 1993, with Carson Lewis, MD, Dr. Gasparotti published the book

"Superficial Liposculpture" which became the world bestseller in the field of lipoaspiration. He is an active member of the Italian Society of Plastic Surgery, Brazilian Society of Plastic Surgery, American Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ASAPS), Lipoplasty Society of North American and the Japanese Society of Plastic Surgery. In 1995 he became Visiting Professor of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the University of Belgrade, Yugoslavia. Since 1988, he has been the professor of Aesthetic Surgery at the second University of Rome and an active member of the American Academy of Sciences.

With over a dozen awards to his name and honorary membership to 20 scientific societies, Dr. Jose Juri is considered one of the world's finest plastic surgeons. Dr. Amar also served as assistant professor at both the Marseille University Hospital and the Marseille Cancer Institute. 
