KEYNOTE SPEAKER

WILLIAM RODMAN SHANKLE, MD The Future of Alzheimers Research



Considered to be one of the world's top contributors to Alzheimer's research. AACS is honored to welcome William R. Shankle, MS, MD as our keynote speaker. After completing undergraduate studies at Stanford, Dr. Shankle went on to receive his medical degree from Brown University, completed an internship at

Cook County Medical Center and a residency in Neurology at LAC/USC Medical Center. In 1988, he founded the Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at UC Irvine where he served as Clinical Director for ten years. During this time. Dr. Shankle established the first website for Alzheimer's Disease and the first electronic medical record for Alzheimer's Disease in the U.S. In 2000, The New York Times Science section reported that Dr. Shankle had made perhaps the most important discovery of the 1990s in neuroscience, and his dedication continues today through his research and practice in Irvine, California.

JONATHAN C. VOGEL, MD Stem Cell Research & Its Application to Cosmetic Surgery



Dr. Jonathan C. Vogel received his M.D. from Rush Medical College in Chicago in 1981. His training includes an internal medicine residency at the Barnes Hospital of the Washington University Medical Center, St. Louis, and a fellowship at the National Cancer Institute. Following a 3-year faculty position at the

Holland Laboratories of the American Red Cross, Rockville, MD, Dr. Vogel joined the Dermatology Branch in the NCI where he has focused on skin gene therapy, specifically targeting keratinocytes.

TINA S. ALSTER, MD Laser Skin Resurfacing: Ablative vs. **Non-Ablative Treatments**



Dr. Tina Alster brings unmatched knowledge of dermatologic laser surgery to this year's meeting. She received both her B.S. and M.D. at Duke University and went on to intern at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, completed a dermatology residency at Yale University, and a laser surgery fellowship in Boston.
