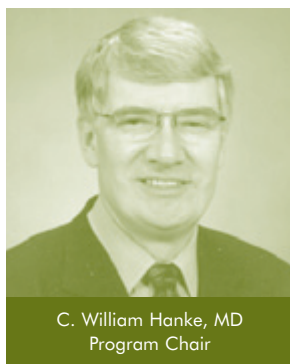

### **Minimal Incision Rhytidectomy – Evolution, Indications, Advantages and Disadvantages**

Daniel C. Baker, MD, a board certified plastic surgeon, has adeptly incorporated both cosmetic and reconstructive plastic surgery into his illustrious career. After graduating from Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons, Dr. Baker completed a surgery internship at San Francisco General Hospital, a general surgery residency at the University of California at San Francisco and a plastic surgery residency at New York University's Institute of Reconstructive Plastic Surgery.



## **ALASTAIR CARRUTHERS, MD**

### **Botox® in 2004**

Dr. Alastair Carruthers is a cosmetic dermatologic surgeon who operates his own clinical practice in Vancouver, BC. He is also a clinical professor of dermatology with the Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia. Dr. Carruthers foremost discovery was the use of the Botox® procedure in cosmetic applications, a discovery he made with his wife, Dr. Jean Carruthers, in 1987. Dr. Carruthers received his medical degree from Brasenose College, Oxford (UK) in 1969, did his dermatology residency at St. John's Hospital for Diseases of the Skin in London and completed his graduate studies in dermatologic surgery at the University of California, San Francisco in 1982.



## **JEAN CARRUTHERS, MD**

### **Prevention of Complications in Aesthetic Blepharoplasty**

Dr. Jean Carruthers is a clinical professor in the Department of Ophthalmology at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver, BC. Her specialty is aesthetic facial ophthalmology. She is a diplomate of the American Board of Cosmetic Surgery and Fellow of the American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. With her husband, Dr. Alastair Carruthers, she pioneered the cosmetic use of Botulinum A exotoxin in 1987, and has remained at the forefront of research and teaching about this important therapeutic modality.



## **STEVEN FAGIEN, MD**

### **My Approach To Aesthetic Blepharoplasty**

Dr. Steven Fagien has been in private practice specializing in aesthetic eyelid plastic surgery in Boca Raton, Florida, since 1988. Dr. Fagien attained his oculoplastics fellowship training at the University of Illinois and is a long-standing member of the American Society of Ophthalmic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery (ASOPRS).





## **ROY G. GERONEMUS, MD**

### **Recent Advances With the Use of Lasers and Related Technologies in the Treatment of Cutaneous Disorders**

Dr. Roy Geronemus, director of the Laser & Skin Surgery Center of New York, graduated from Harvard University and pursued his medical education at the University of Miami School of Medicine. He trained in dermatology at the New York University Medical Center, where he was chief resident and subsequently underwent a fellowship training in Mohs Micrographic Surgery and Cutaneous Oncology. He is clinical professor of dermatology at the New York University Medical Center, where he founded its laser program and served nine years as chief of dermatologic and laser surgery. He is also the director of the skin/laser division in the Department of Plastic Surgery at the New York Eye & Ear Infirmary.



## **ROBERT F. JACKSON, MD**

### **What's New in Liposuction and Breast Augmentation**

With over 30 years of surgical experience and more than 20 years experience with cosmetic procedures, Dr. Robert Jackson is considered one of the pioneers in the field of liposuction surgery. Dr. Jackson is double board-certified, having passed the American Board of Cosmetic Surgery and the American Board of Surgery. He received his medical degree from Indiana University School of Medicine, completed his surgical internship at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis, Indiana, and served his residency at Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton, Ohio.
