Angelo Cuzalina, MD, DDS, is the immediate past president of the AACS. He has served on the AACS Board of Trustees since 2005, and he also serves on the American Board of Cosmetic Surgery. Dr. Cuzalina is board

certified by the ABCS in general cosmetic surgery and is also certified by the American Board of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery. He is an author and lecturer on all areas of cosmetic surgery and is in private practice in Tulsa, Okla. He has an AACS accredited fellowship program with two fellows per year.

Patrick Trevidic, MD, is a plastic, reconstructive and aesthetic surgeon who currently serves as Head of the Surgery Department at the Hôpital Sainte-Anne, Paris. Dr. Trevidic, as well as being instrumental as

a key investigator in several anti-aging studies, has published more than 50 scientific articles in various periodicals and international journals. To date, he has participated in over 100 medical congresses around the world and currently serves as scientific director of Expert2Expert, the renowned European group of surgeons and cosmetic specialists. Dr. Trevidic will be joining us this year to discuss his latest insights on the procedure of tear trough correction, a subject on which he is one of the world's foremost experts.

Alexander A. Krakovsky MD, PhD, DrSc, FAAPS, is an internationally-renowned speaker and educator in the areas of cosmetic, plastic and aesthetic surgery. During his keynote address, he will discuss his

up-to-date phalloplasty surgical technique as it relates to penile triple augmentation. Dr. Krakovsky is currently the only plastic/cosmetic surgeon in the United States performing penile augmentation with both AlloDerm and DFGs, and he holds the trademarks for both the Penile Dual Augmentation $^{\text{TM}}$ and Penile Triple Augmentation $^{\text{TM}}$ surgical methods.

Dr. Ira Papel currently serves as both an Associate Professor at Johns Hopkins University and the co-director of the Facial Plastic Fellowship at Johns Hopkins Hospital. Over the course of his career he has been invited to serve

as a visiting professor at more than 30 universities throughout the United States, Europe, Asia, Mexico and South America. His textbook, *Facial Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery* is now in its third edition, and has become a standard text for surgical students all over the world. Dr. Papel is a former President of the American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and is currently the President of the American Board of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery.

André Vieira Braz, MD, is a clinical dermatologist and dermatologic surgeon based in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. In addition to being a medical practitioner, Dr. Braz serves as both an assistant teacher of cosmetic

dermatology and a scientific coordinator and teacher of applied anatomy for botulinum toxin and hyaluronic acid injections at Policlinica Geral do Rio de Janeiro. Dr. Braz speaks regularly to international audiences on the subjects of botulinum toxin, hyaluronic acid implants, filling techniques, cosmetic and therapeutic indications, hyperhidrosis and the use of lasers in dermatology. Dr. Braz will discuss his research on the patterns of contraction as relating to the frontalis muscle during his keynote address.

Needs Assessment Summary Statement

The AACS developed its 29th Annual Scientific Meeting in response to documented needs. Pursuant to data obtained in post-evaluation surveys from the 28th Annual Scientific Meeting, live surgery workshops, interviews, expert opinions and research from professional publications, the following top five areas of interest were identified: Blepharoplasty and Browlift; Advanced Topics in Breast Surgery; Rhinoplasty and Otoplasty; Live Patient Demonstrations; and Vein Surgery for the Cosmetic Surgeon.

The Meeting was designed to address the need for programs that allow faculty to review basic surgical skills and knowledge; complications; managing the breast of the massive weight loss patient; fat retrieval and transplants in the hands, face and buttocks; mastopexy and reduction combined procedures; facelifts, neck lifts, blepharoplasty, rhinoplasty, otoplasty; and new technologies with lasers, stem cells in facial rejuvenation.

Responsively, the Meeting aims to deliver didactic and handson learning such as is demonstrated in the following symposia: Complications in Cosmetic Surgery: Diagnosis and Management; Breast Implant Revision Surgery; Live Patient Demonstrations for Cosmetic Surgeons; and Latest Approaches in the Use of Lasers and Radio Frequency Technology in Cosmetic Procedures.

Other educational practice gaps identified in the 2013 Education Needs Assessment have been incorporated into the 2013 Education Program activities.


